- Assess the level of DRR (Disaster risk reduction) knowledge of schoolchildren and teachers after theoretical & practical trainings

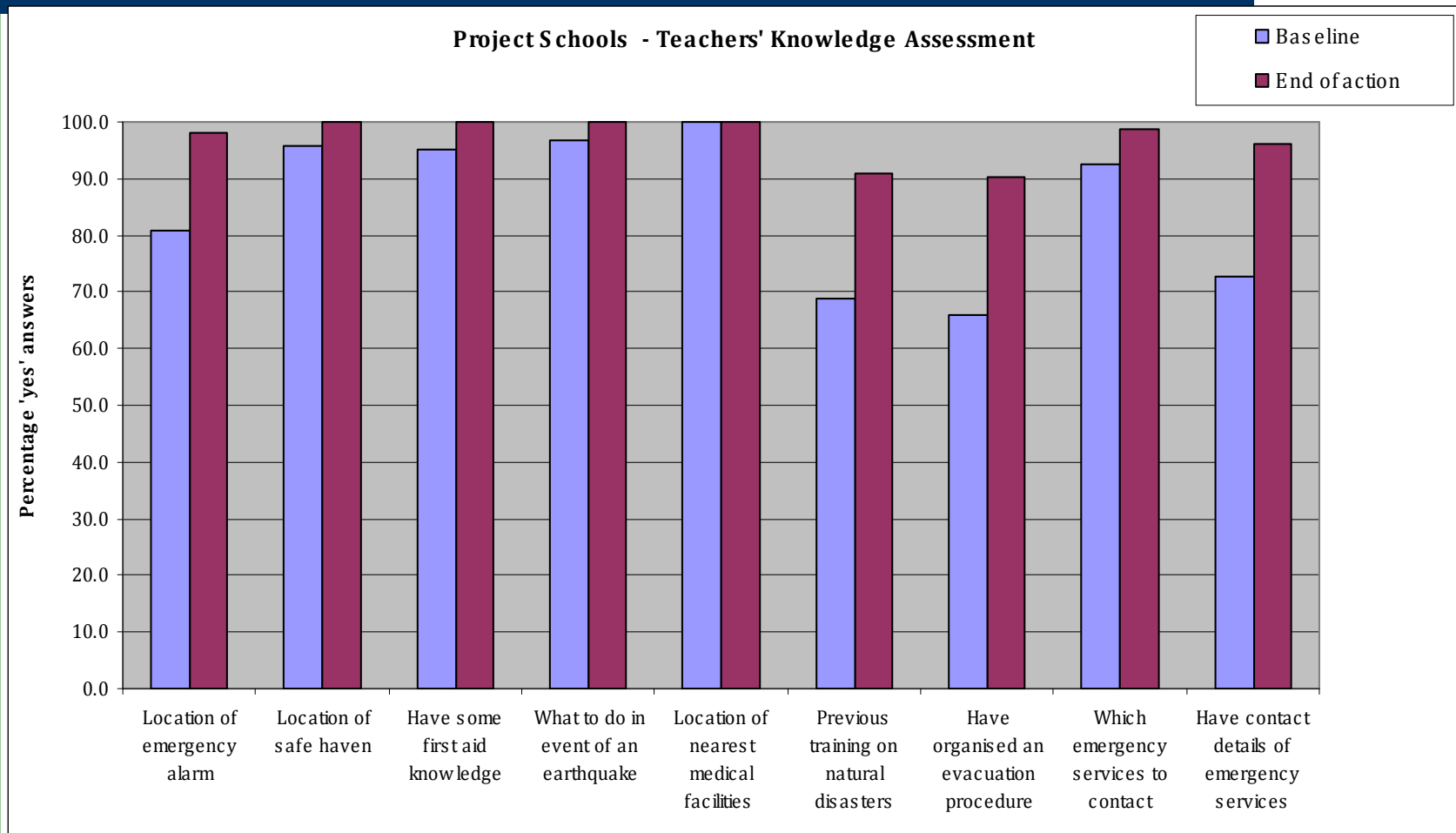
Methodology

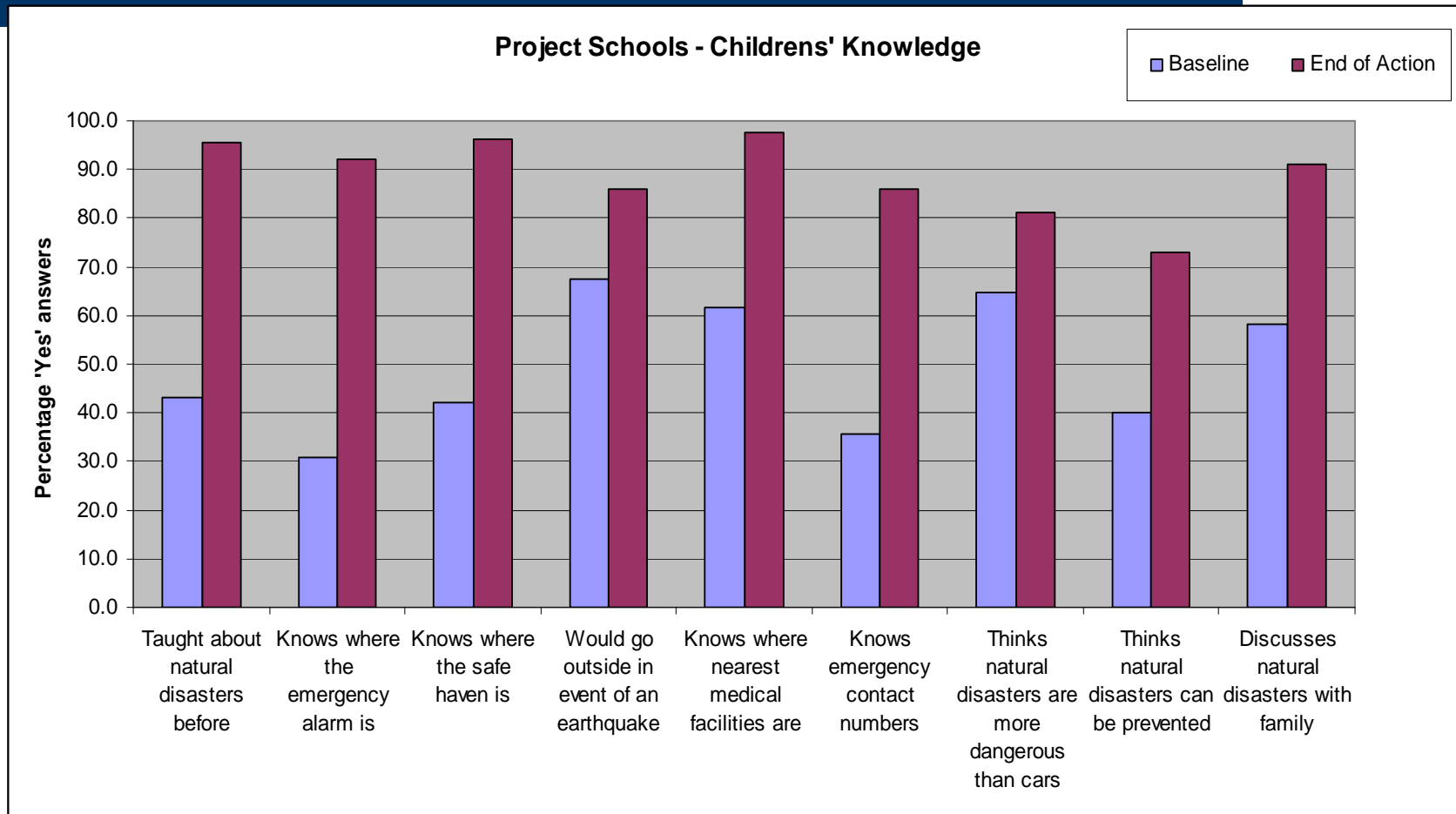

Results from baseline and end-of-action surveys of children in project schools



Increase of children's knowledge between the baseline & end-of-action survey in project schools (in%)

Questions	Percentage increase
	Project schools
Have you been taught about natural disasters before?	52.3
Do you know what the emergency alarm is?	61.1
Do you know where the safe haven is in your school?	54.0
If there is an earthquake would you go outside?	18.4
Do you know where the nearest medical facilities are?	36.0
Do you know what number to call in an emergency?	50.4
Are natural disasters more dangerous than cars?	16.3
Do you think natural disasters can be prevented?	32.7
Do you discuss natural disasters at home?	32.8

Conclusion

- Improvement in knowledge and understanding of natural disasters
- Children (theoretical and practical trainings)
- Teachers would still like more training on natural disasters (should be given regularly)
- Visual aids (brochures, flyers and posters)
